But I know this scriptural application won't make a difference to this man, who had the audacity to come to this conference on "ableism in the church" only to dismiss it as trivial because he's never heard of ableism before now. "This isn't the gospel," he definitively announces, "so we shouldn't get distracted. Where does the Bible say we should care about the disabled people?"

"Luke 14, I want to reply, but I know this question is rhetorical, with a side of sass. People often hide behind the slippery slope argument when asked to consider a perspective different from their own. The lurking fear of slippery slopes governs the public space. If this, then what? As though we'll descend into chaos if we are the least bit more inclusive.
